Whakaraupō Moana Programme

Sunday 12th May – Friday 17th May 2024

In partnership with Environment Canterbury, the Whaka-ora Healthy Harbour partnership and Rātā Foundation, we are excited to embark on our first Whakaraupō Moana Programme.

‘Ki uta, ki tai’ - Our programmes focus on the natural environment from land to sea and empower rangatahi to understand their role as guardians of these environments. This is our 20th year running programmes in Canterbury. Our programmes’ purpose is to enable young people to explore and understand the complexity of issues within the natural environment, aligning with the kaupapa of Untouched World that established the Foundation. Whakaraupō Moana participants, with support from Ngāti Wheke, will be exposed to, and interact with, all players; from mana whenua, governance, commercial, environmental and those that call Whakaraupō home.

The programme begins with a journey of Whakaraupō before being welcomed to the Rāpaki marae. The following four days are spent delving deep into the issues of the harbour and their drivers. Finishing off with the participants collectively integrating their new insights into an intergenerational workshop leading to action.
